- 1. This course is designed to acquaint a student with the conceptual and operational parameters of various general principles relating to contract law.

Capacity of Parties: Minor – Agreements with a minor; persons of unsound mind; disqualified persons. Free Consent: Coercion - Undue influence - Misrepresentation-Fraud - Mistake - mistake of law; mistake of fact - Effect of vitiating elements.

UNIT – III

Legality of object: When consideration or object is unlawful? - Unlawful and illegal agreements -Effect of illegality - Agreements opposed to public policy - Agreements in restraint of trade - exceptions - Void agreements - uncertain agreements - Wagering agreements - Contingent contracts - Rules relating to contingent contracts - Doctrine of Restitution.

UNIT - IV

Performance of contract: Offer to perform - Devolution of joint liabilities and rights -Time and place of performance – Reciprocal promises – order of performance of reciprocal promises – Time as the essence of the contract - assignment of contracts - appropriation of payments Rule in Clayton's case. Discharge of contract: by performance; by agreement or consent; by impossibility of performance; by lapse of time; by operation of law; by breach of contract. Quasi contract - Kinds of Quasi contract - Remedies for breach of contract: Rescission of contract; suit for damages - rules relating to damages; suit upon guantum meruit; suit for specific performance; suit for injunction.

UNIT – V

Specific Relief Act: Recovering possession of property - general principles guiding specific performance -Contracts specifically enforced - Contracts which cannot be specifically enforced - Parties in relation to specific performance - Specific performance of part - Rectification of instruments - Rescission -Cancellation of instruments – Declaratory decrees - Preventive relief – Injunction.
